The children in nursery continued with the theme of people who help us.

As a group we have been learning about coastguards and the important job they do in keeping us safe at the beach.

The children were excited to recreate their versions of coastguards.





We also received the visit of Kim Lambden, Physical Literacy Adviser of Health Education Partnership, with whom we have organized a variety of activities full of music and games to enrich our physical, social and emotional development.



This week KS1 went to one of the local parks to discover who the Wright Brothers were and their invention of an aeroplane.

In groups the children each made a different model of a paper aeroplane.







Then each group tested their planes.

We then took the plane which travelled the furthest from each group and tested them against each other.

We tested the planes again, this time measuring the distance in *'piedi di Anna'*.






We discovered that from the four models, the two models that had narrower wings and shape travelled the furthest. The children had a chance to think why this happened, and together with the help of Sergio we learnt that the shape of the wings of the paper aeroplanes plays an important part in how far they fly, the flatter and narrower the wings are, the furthest the plane travel.

Year 2 - Italiano

Si laureo` nel 1864.Al termine degli studi macchina a motore inizio` il lavoro di apprendista in una officina e nel 1866 divento` progettista di bilance.Nel 1869 comincio` a lavorare per un'azienda che progettava ponti. La macchina a motore Il 31 dicembre del 1878 Karl costrui` un nuovo motore da usare per le machine. Questa fu una grande invenzione; prima di allora non esisteva uno strumento capace di spostare un mezzo senza cavalli. Karl Benz e il successo La prima auto dotata di motore a scoppio universalmente riconosciuta, fu ufficialmente presentata il 3 luglio 1886 e raggiungeva una velocità massima di 15 km/h. Ma il pilastro fondamentale dell'evoluzione della vettura, ciò che la portò al successo, avvenne grazie alla moglie <u>Bertha Benz</u>: fu infatti lei a rubare uno dei 3 prototipi di Karl per raggiungere la cittadina di Pforzoheim, per far visita alla madre, con un viaggio storico lungo circa 104 chilometri.Grazie a questo "test su strada" l'idea dell'auto divento' popolare. Karl Benz diventò così il personaggio più importante nella storia dell'automobile

Year 3 & 4 – Science Museum Trip

Year 3 and Year 4 went to see the wonders of science and the history that have allowed us the luxuries of modern day living.

The children discovered the first mechanical uses of a clock and learnt about the way humans originally told the time using sundials. They heard about how the Queen promoted the use of the first telecommunication device and the investigations that took place beforehand, through a line of individuals holding cables together across vast stretches of land. They discovered the previous modes of transportation from the horse drawn carriage to the first motor car. Both year groups enjoyed the interactive sections of lights that reflected their movements in a disco pod and finally used machines to show what they looked like when they were a baby and how they would look as an adult.











Year 3 – Italiano

This week Year 4 has been researching the reasons that animals have become endangered.

The children used computers to find out how many of their chosen species were still alive and how ecologists and communities were working together to protect them and increase their numbers so that these animals would not become extinct.

They researched their animals' ideal habitat and what threats are occurring, their life expectancy, appearance and survival techniques. Finally, they chose a picture to turn into a stained glass image of their animal to place into our rainforest display.







Year 5 & 6 – Book Talk






Year 5 & 6 – Science
