
Year 1 – Matematica: Quanta pizza hai mangiato?

OUR KS2

Year 3 – Maths

This half-term we started a new topic, shape. This included identifying and naming angles acute, obtuse, right and reflex.

The children learnt that an angle was a turn around a fixed point between two connected lines. They learnt the unit of measurement used for angles was called degrees and which ranges matched each of the four angles listed above.

Year 3 also used their prior knowledge of ‘time’ clockwise, anti-clockwise, quarter past, half past, quarter to and whole to identify the turn of a given angle; enabling them to state whether, for example, an angle was a quarter turn anti-clockwise.

They finally learnt and used the rhyme ‘Never, Eat, Shredded, Wheat’ to add more detail about the direction of a turn; ‘if the arrow starts at North and it is a three quarter turn, it can end up facing West or East depending on if it is turning clockwise or anti-clockwise.

La lezione di religione di questa settimana ci ha avvicinati ad una persona di forte fede: Fauja Singh.




In una delle tante interviste, Fauja Singh racconta che la scelta di iniziare a correre è stata dettata dalla necessità di ritrovare la serenità, dopo la perdita della moglie e di un figlio. Da quel momento ha cominciato e non ha mai smesso di correre.

Il suo motto è: "Sorridi e continua a correre".
